## CAMP LEJEUNE JUSTICE ACT

**NOTICE:** If you served, resided, or worked at the Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, or at the Marine Corps Air Station New River located in Jacksonville, North Carolina **from August 1953 through December 1987**, and were exposed to the water, you and your family may have a claim to recover disability benefits. **Members of the military, military staff**, **non-military staff**, **civilian contractors**, **and families of deceased victims all may be eligible to file claims**.

If you believe that you or a family member were exposed to the toxic water, and you want to submit a claim, you must submit proof that:

- You lived or worked at Camp Lejeune or MCAS New River for at least 30 cumulative days from August 1953 through December 1987 (Utility bills, housing records, military orders, tax forms, etc.);
- You were a veteran, reservist, Guardsman or a civil contractor who was exposed to the contaminated water;
- You did not receive a dishonorable discharge when you separated from the military; and
- You were diagnosed with one of the following medical conditions:

Bladder cancer
Esophageal cancer
Hepatic steatosis
Leukemia
Miscarriage
Myelodysplastic syndromes

Breast cancer
Female infertility
Kidney cancer
Lung cancer
Multiple myeloma
Neurobehavioral effects

Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma Renal toxicity Scleroderma Parkinson's disease

Renal toxicity
Miscarriage
Birth defects and birth injury
Neurobehavioral effects
